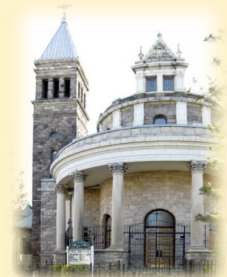

## PAPA FRANCISCO AUDIENCIA GENERAL

Vicios y virtudes. 13. La justicia

Queridos hermanos y hermanas, ¡Feliz Pascua!

Llegamos hoy a la segunda de las virtudes cardinales: **justicia**.

Es la virtud social por excelencia. El *Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica* la define así: «La virtud moral que consiste en la constante y firme voluntad de dar a Dios y al prójimo lo que les es debido» (#. 1807). A menudo, cuando se nombra la justicia, se cita también el lema que la representa: “a cada uno lo suyo”. Es la virtud del derecho, que trata de regular las relaciones entre las personas con equidad.

Su finalidad es que en una sociedad cada uno sea tratado según su dignidad. Pero los antiguos maestros ya enseñaban que esto requiere también otras actitudes virtuosas, como la benevolencia, el respeto, la gratitud, la afabilidad, la honestidad: virtudes que contribuyen a la buena convivencia entre las personas. La justicia es una virtud para una buena convivencia entre las personas; es fundamental para la convivencia pacífica en la sociedad.

*Un mundo sin leyes que respeten los derechos sería un mundo en el que es imposible vivir.*

En la tradición se pueden encontrar innumerables descripciones de la persona justa. Veamos algunas de ellas. La persona justa ve las leyes y las respeta, sabiendo que son una barrera que protege a los indefensos de la arrogancia de los poderosos.

**La persona justa no sólo se preocupa por su bienestar individual, sino que quiere el bien de toda la sociedad. Por eso, no cede a la tentación de pensar sólo en sí mismo.** La persona justa siempre pide

disculpas. En algunas situaciones es capaz de sacrificar un bien personal para ponerlo a disposición de la comunidad.

Además, el justo rehúye comportamientos nocivos como la calumnia, el falso testimonio, el fraude, la usura, la burla, la deshonestidad.

**El justo mantiene la palabra dada, devuelve lo que ha recibido prestado, reconoce un salario justo a los trabajadores.**

El justo atraen gracia y bendiciones tanto sobre sí como sobre el mundo en el que viven. Necesitamos ser hombres y mujeres justos, y esto nos hará felices.

## POPE FRANCIS GENERAL AUDIENCE

Vices and Virtues. 13. Justice

Dear brothers and sisters, Happy Easter, good morning!

Here we are at the second of the cardinal virtues: **justice**. It is the quintessential social virtue. The *Catechism of the Catholic Church* defines it as “the moral virtue that consists in the constant and firm will to give their due to God and neighbour” (#. 1807). Often, when justice is mentioned, the motto that represents it is also quoted: “*unicuique suum*” — that is, “to each his own”. It is the virtue of law, that seeks to regulate relations between people equitably.

Its purpose is that everyone in society be treated with the dignity. But the ancient masters had already taught that in order for this to occur, other virtuous attitudes are also necessary, such as benevolence, respect, gratitude, affability, and honesty: virtues that contribute to a good coexistence between people. Justice is a virtue for the good coexistence of people.

In tradition we can find countless descriptions of the righteous person. Let us look at some of them.



The righteous person reveres laws and respects them, knowing that they constitute a barrier protecting the defenseless from the tyranny of the powerful. **The righteous**

**person does not only think of his own individual well-being, but desires the good of society as a whole.** Therefore, he does not give in to the temptation to think only of himself and of taking care of his own affairs, however legitimate they may be, as if they were the only thing that exists in the world. The virtue of justice makes it clear and places this need in the heart that there can be no true good for oneself if there is not also the good of all.

Furthermore, the righteous person shuns harmful behavior such as slander, perjury, fraud, usury, mockery and dishonesty. **The righteous person keeps his word, returns what he has borrowed, pays fair wages to all laborers.**

They are people who draw grace and blessings both upon themselves and upon the world in which they live. We need to be righteous men and women, and this will make us happy.
